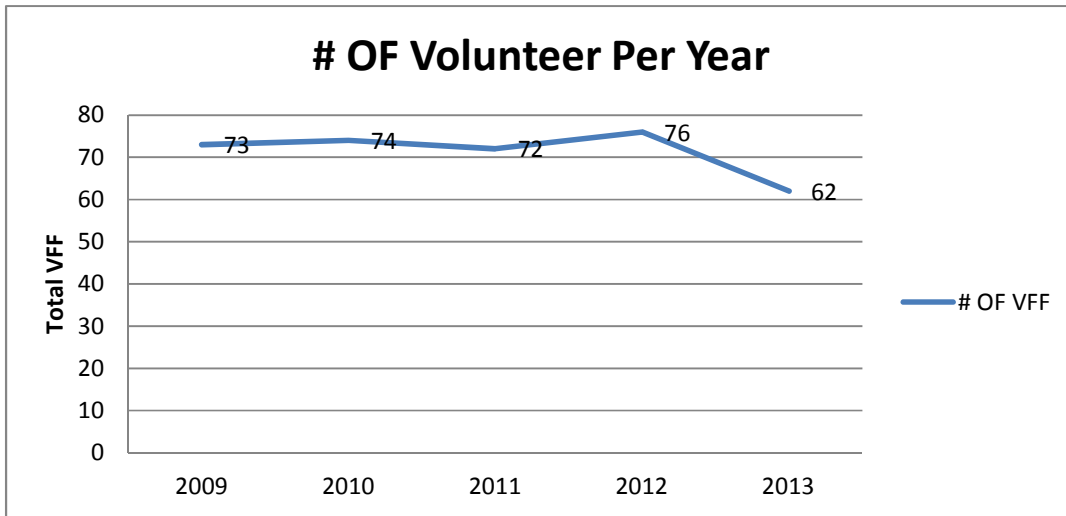


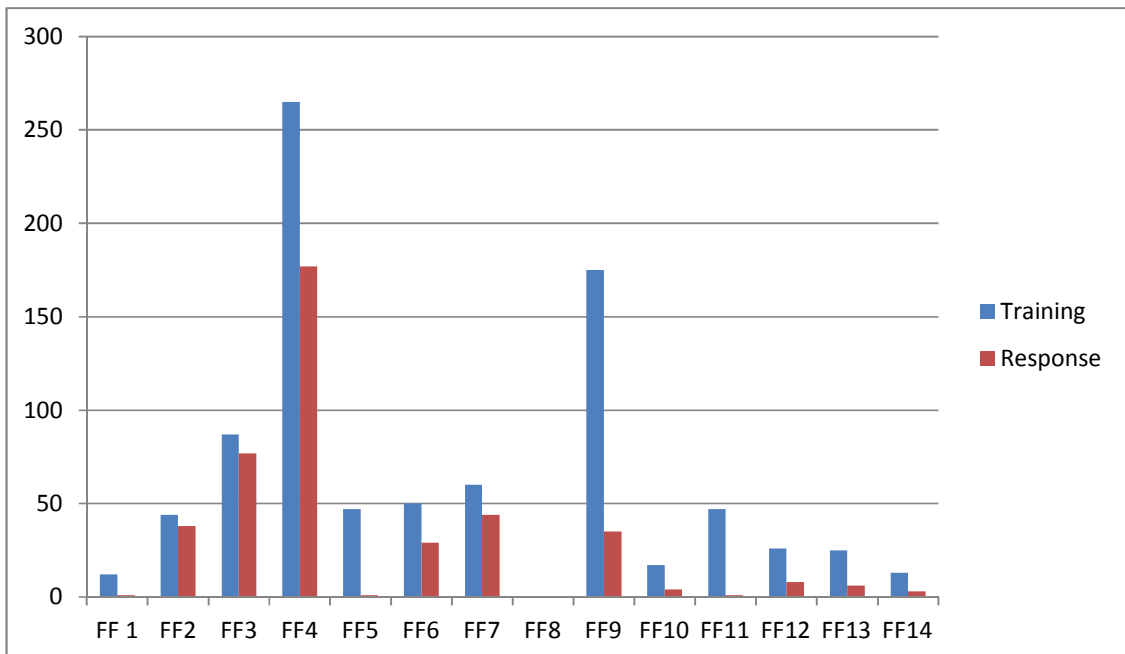
Volunteer Fire Fighters Report
